Saint-George, Joseph- Classical Musician (African American)

Bernstein, Leonard -nineteenth-century American musician whose many compositions include "Oh, Susannah," "Jeanie with the Light Brown Hair," "My Old Kentucky Home," and "Old Folks at Home."

Gershwin, George - American Jewish composer (1898-1937)

Benny Goodman- Jewish Jazz musician (1909-)

Joplin, Scott – Composer (African American)

Ma, Yo-Yo – Cellist (Chinese American)

Marsalis, Wynton – Trumpet player of popular, jazz, and classical music (African American)

Bryant, Jen – French composer who wrote while detained in a German Prison Camp during WWII.

Newton, John - British slave trader who rejected his calling became a minister, and wrote the words to the popular hymn "Amazing Grace." (1725-1807)

Ozawa, Seiji - Japanese conductor famous for directing major western orchestras worldwide

Parker, Charlie - famous saxophonist and his style of jazz known as bebop (1920-1955)
