## Congratulations to Our Scholarship Winners!

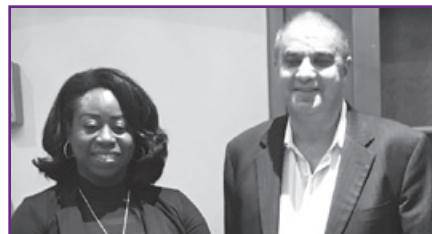
